Every Wednesday from 2:45pm to 3:10pm this half term the children will be going into what we call our Family Groups. This is instead of the normal assembly the children have at the end of the day.

## A replacement to the Pirate Ship


Our much loved Pirate Ship is beginning to show signs of its age. The maintenance costs for it are increasing year on year and we are rapidly reaching the point where it will no longer be safe for the children to use.

We have spent the past two months looking at options from different companies and we have finally settled on a design for replacing it.

Our criteria for the replacement was that it had to provide the children with better opportunities for physical development than the current pirate ship. It also had to provide opportunities for creative role play. Finally it had to look visually inviting and fit in with the equipment we currently have.

Below is the design of the new structure. We hope that you like it and that you agree that it will enhance the play experience for all the children for many years to come.

The work on building it will begin in a few weeks and the new equipment will be ready for the children to use after the Christmas break.

### PART-TIME CLEANER – 10 hours per week
