School Crossing Patrol on Budds Lane

The Hampshire County Council School Crossing Patrol Service currently has a large team of dedicated community-minded men and women carrying out the important role of ensuring the safety of children on their way to and from school.

We currently have a vacancy on Budds Lane, Bordon. We would be keen to hear from parents, grandparents and members of the local community who can demonstrate traffic awareness, a sense of responsibility and are keen to show dedication and commitment in carrying out this important role to make the roads of Hampshire safer for children travelling to and from School.

Experience is not necessary as full training will be provided, more important are your personal qualities and commitment to provide a safe crossing environment for children travelling between home and school during term time.

Additional information you may require:

Patrol working hours are up to 1 hour in the morning and up to 1 hour in the afternoon during school term-time. A uniform is provided to protect you against the elements. Starting salary is £8.12 per hour plus a payment in lieu of holidays. The post is subject to an Enhanced DBS check

We realise the difficulty this places on working parents but the rules are there to keep all children safe and healthy.

SPEEDWATCH SOON TO BE A REALITY FOR WHITEHILL & BORDON

That is the news from County Councillor Adam Carew who is paying for the scheme to be set up in Whitehill and Bordon from his County councillors grant.

Adam Carew has said,

“After extensive discussions with residents and the Police we now have enough volunteers to set up SpeedWatch schemes in infamous rat runs in Hogmoor Road, Budds Lane, Drift Road, Liphook Road, Walldown Road, and hopefully part of Hollywater Road.

There is no doubt that speed down our lanes is a big issue for residents who live along the roads affected but also for the safety of our children and local schools. Although I have managed to reduce speed limits on all the roads affected there is sadly little enforcement. SpeedWatch will help solve this. The idea is that the equipment will be shared for the whole town between two groups one based in Hogmoor and one in Hollywater.

The only problem is that SpeedWatch cannot be used in roads over 30 Mph.

I have repeated my demand for 30 mph speed limits through out Hogmoor Road and Hollywater Road but I am now looking into funding SID - Speed Indicator Devices for Hollywater Road and neighbouring Lindford.

SpeedWatch is only designed for roads where speeding and rat running are a major problem. People should travel at 30 mph in town and take extra care near crossings and especially outside schools, hospitals, play areas, skate parks and shopping areas - the safety of our children in paramount. If people want to drive faster than 30 mph the safest place is on the Motorway.

My thanks to our volunteers, the Police and Hampshire Highways for all their support. It is hoped that SpeedWatch will be up and running by late January 2018, following Police training”.
