School Uniform

Girls head bands, boys haircuts and black shoes

At school we believe that school uniform serves a couple of purposes. Firstly it gives the children a sense of belonging to a community and it also helps establish a sense of pride in themselves and their work. Helping your child wear the right uniform at an early age does make a big difference to them later on in life when they are having to take responsibility for their own appearance. We believe that uniform and appearance at Infant school should achieve the same high standards and expectations as Junior and Secondary school.
