Sickness and absence from school

At this time of year there are a lot of bugs going around both in and out of school. The normal advice at this time still applies if your child is feeling ill. If you think a dose of capol will help get them through then still send them in. Unfortunately we are only able to administer prescription medicine, not capol. Parents are welcome to come in and give children capol if they would like.

If your child is too ill to be in school then the very best place for them is at home. Please remember to ring the school office to let us know if your child is going to be off, as schools have a duty to ensure we know where all children are.

If your child is physically sick at home or at school, or has an upset tummy then please keep them off for 48 hours from the last time they were sick or had a runny tummy. We understand how difficult this is for many parents, most of the staff in school have had to juggle this themselves with work. It is really important that children are not brought back to school until the 48 hours are up. This is to reduce the likelihood that they are still carrying germs and to help stop the infection spreading. These guidelines come direct from the NHS.

On occasions there is an increase in sickness bugs at school, during these times we will err on the side of caution and we apologise if we send a child home and they are not actually sick. We never like keeping children away from school but we do have to be strict with the 48 hour rule. So if they were ill at 10:40am then please keep them off until lunchtime two days later. We have a duty to ensure we are taking the right course of action for every child in school and these procedures are there to ensure children miss as little school as possible due to ill health.

All Year 2 parents will need to apply for a Junior school place between now and the 15th January. This can be done online by going to the Hampshire admissions website <u>https://www.hants.gov.uk/educationandlearning/admissions/applicationprocess</u> or you can Google Hampshire school place application and this should take you to the right place. Alternatively you can come into school and speak to Mrs Edney in the main office and she will be able to help you.
