This is all down to your generosity and the hard work of all the members of the FoBS committee who put so much time and effort in to setting up the day, running it and making it a huge success.

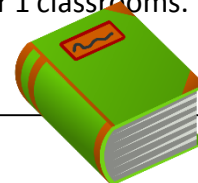
School Library
