Children playing before and after school

The school has a lot of play equipment outside that children often play on before and after school.

The play equipment is designed for school aged children and it was installed under the assumption that children would be supervised while playing on it.

School staff supervise the children during playtime and lunch time but do not supervise either before or after school.

As a school we rely on parents to supervise their own children before and after school. Please ensure you watch your children, especially any younger children who might not know the school rules for using the equipment.

Unwell Children

If children are a little under the weather and a dose of Calpol will pick them up then do send them into school.

If children are physically sick twice or more or have an upset stomach then they need to stay off school for 48 hours after the sickness has ended. This is to ensure they are no longer contagious and do not pass the illness on to others.

If your child is too ill to attend school please phone the school office in the morning to let us know and leave a message. If we have not had a phone call we will phone you to confirm why they are not at school.
